Joseph Carter  
Will

In the name of God, Amen. I Joseph  
Carter of Russel County and state of Virginia, being  
in perfect health, but calling to mind the mortality  
of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all  
men once to die, do make this my last Will and  
Testament in manner following; that is to say -  
principally I first of all give and recommend  
my soul to God that gave it and my body to the  
earth to be buried in a Christian like manner  
decent burial. - And as touching such worldly  
goods wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me  
in this life, I give and dispose of the same in  
manner and form following; that is to say - .

First, I will and bequeath all my estate both  
real and personal to my dearly beloved wife Elizabeth  
Carter, during her natural life, and at her death  
I give and bequeath the plantation whereon I now  
live to my two sons Preiley & Thomas to be equally  
divided between them agreeable to quantity and quality  
each to have an equal share in the Spring and  
timber on the land and Preiley to have  
that part of the land that he now lives on, and  
Thomas to have that part of the land which I now live on

To my daughter Elizabeth Carter I will & bequeath  
the bed which she claims and all its furniture

To my son Thomas Carter I give and bequeath  
one bed & furniture, and I give the slaves which  
shall be in my estate at the time of my death to  
such of my children as shall be willing to retain  
them in slavery to be equally divided between  
them. And all the remainder of my estate I leave  
to be equally divided between all my children to

wit - Anna, Mima, Elijah, Betsy, Judy, Presley and Thomas; and any thing that I have given or shall give to my children during my lifetime is not to be brought into division after my death.

It is also my will and desire that my children shall divide my estate agreeable to my will without administration or appraisement.

And lastly, I do hereby revoke and disannul all and every former will or testaments by me heretofore made, ratifying and confirming this the other to be my last will & testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this nineteenth day of February 1818.
